APPLYING FOR A VISA AT HULL

INFORMATION ABOUT APPLYING FOR THE MULTIPLE ENTRIES TOURIST VISA

ALL INFORMATION PROVIDED IS ON THE BASIS THAT THE APPLICANT WILL BE APPLYING FOR THEIR VISA IN PERSON AT THE ROYAL THAI CONSULATE HULL. PERSONS INTENDING TO APPLY ELSEWHERE FOR THEIR VISA NEED TO CHECK WITH THE RELEVANT AUTHORITY

THIS VISA IS ISSUED IN PERSON ONLY AT HULL, USUALLY WITHIN ONE HOUR

The Tourist Visa with **MULTIPLE ENTRIES** is valid for 6 months from date of issue and allows an unlimited number of entries within the 6-month validity of the visa and each entry allows a stay of 60 days maximum. If exiting Thailand before the 60th day all remaining days of that entry are lost. It may be possible to extend one of the 60-day stays by a further 30 days by visiting a local Thai Immigration Office. The fee for the extension is THB1900.

The validity of this visa is 6 calendar months from date of issue. The expiry date of the visa shows on the visa sticker as the **ENTER BEFORE** date. So, for example, if the visa was issued on **01 JAN 2019 (DATE OF ISSUE)**, the **ENTER BEFORE** date would be **30 JUN 2019**. This means that your **final** entry into Thailand must be no later than **29 June 2019**. Each time you enter Thailand you receive a rectangular stamp in your passport stating your date of entry and the **ADMITTED UNTIL** date which will be 60 days after your date of entry. Do **not** remain in Thailand beyond the **ADMITTED UNTIL** date. Each time you exit Thailand you will receive a triangular stamp in your passport stating date of exiting Thailand. You should be able to re-enter Thailand immediately for a further stay of 60 days provided your entry is before the **ENTER BEFORE** date as showing on your visa. There is no restriction on the number of times you can enter whilst the visa remains valid. With careful planning, by saving the 30-day extension for your final entry, it is possible to get an accumulation of almost 9 months in Thailand. If you make your final entry into Thailand a couple of days **before** the **ENTER BEFORE** date as shown on the visa you should be granted your final 60-day stay and then you could visit a Thai Immigration Office near to where you are staying in Thailand on about day 55 of your 60-day stay and request the 30-day extension.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A VISA AT THE ROYAL THAI CONSULATE, HULL

It is necessary for the applicant or someone nominated by the applicant to visit us **in person**.

To apply for the Tourist Visa with **MULTIPLE ENTRIES** each applicant needs to provide the following:-

1. Completed Visa Application Form with two recent passport type photos attached.
The form is available for completion when visiting us.
2. Passport with minimum 6 months remaining validity at time of travel and with at least two blank pages for the visa and for entry/exit stamps).
For holders of a UK passport it must state that they are a BRITISH CITIZEN.
Holders of UK passport which states they are a BRITISH OVERSEAS CITIZEN must obtain a visa for all visits to Thailand even if only for one day.

Holders of all other passports need to check document “**Visas & Info Downloads > V2 – Visa Requirements by Nationality**” which is on our website (www.thaiconsul-uk.com) and must provide evidence that they are entitled to be in the UK (visa or residence card) and also provide evidence of where they live in the UK (utility bill, bank account statement, UK Driving Licence or UK residence permit showing their name and address in the UK).

Nationals of the following countries must apply only at the Royal Thai Embassy in London:-

Afghanistan, Algeria, Bangladesh, Cameroon, Central African Republic, People's Republic of China, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Republic of the Congo, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Ghana, Guinea, India, Iraq, Iran, North Korea, Lebanon, Liberia, Libya, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Sao Tome and Principe, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria, and Yemen.

3. Copies of your latest 6 month’s bank statements showing a minimum of £5,000 (or equivalent in certain other currencies) at the beginning/end of each month. Bank statements must show applicant’s name and address. Children up to the age of 20 years are not required to meet these financial requirements provided they are travelling with a parent (copy of child’s birth certificate required). If using business bank account statements the statements must:
 - a) also show the name of the applicant.
 - and
 - b) be supported by a copy of the company’s Register of Shareholders.

Married couples are each required to meet these requirement.

Children up to the age of 20 years are not required to meet these financial requirements provided they are travelling with a parent (copy of child’s birth certificate required).

4. If employed, a letter from employer confirming that you are employed by them.
or
If self-employed, copy of your HMRC SA100 or SA105 Self Assessment Tax Form for the latest tax year.
or
If retired (at any age) and receiving a State or Private Pension, confirmation of receiving such pension by providing a copy of the Pension Statement or similar which must bear the applicant’s name and address.
5. Copy of Confirmed Outward and Return or Onward Air Ticket to and from Thailand.
The return or onward flight booking can be to any other country and must be no later than 8 months after first entering Thailand.
6. Copy of reservation from the first hotel or similar where staying in Thailand.
or
If staying in Thailand with relatives or friends, copy of an electricity utility bill showing their name and address in Thailand (this may be in Thai language).
or
If renting a property in Thailand, a copy of the rental agreement showing your name and the address in Thailand.
7. Visa fee **until 31 March 2019**: £125 plus £10 processing charge - total of **£135 in cash only**.
Visa fee **from 1 April 2019**: £150 plus £10 processing charge - total of **£160 in cash only**.

Applicants who cannot provide ALL the above can be granted only a SINGLE ENTRY Tourist Visa.

We offer a service whereby applicants can e-mail to us all documentation in advance for us to check prior to visiting us. We then inform the applicant if everything is in order or if we require any further documents. When everything meets the requirement we will invite the applicant to visit us in person so that we can issue the visa into their passport.
